Financial Aid Applications




Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- The FAFSA is the first step in the financial aid process for most students
- It is used to apply for state and federal financial aid programs
 - Pathway for most students to apply for the IL MAP Grant
- Generates an Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
 - Used to calculate financial aid eligibility
- Most colleges use it to award institutional aid
- The application is available at **no cost**



The Big Grants

Maximum award amounts for 2021 -22



• Total = \$11,991



Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid (Alternative App)

Provides a pathway for eligible undocumented students and transgender students who are disqualified from federal student aid to apply for the MAP Grant

Note: Although Selective Service registration is no longer required to qualify for federal financial aid, there is still a federal law requiring Selective Service registration for those who are under 26 and assigned a male gender at birth. This federal requirement continues to apply to both citizens and noncitizens.

Alternative Application Process

- Pre-screening questions available to first time applicants
- An ISAC ID number is assigned once the applicant creates a Student Profile
- The Alternative Application is patterned after the FAFSA
 - Uses the same EFC formula to determine MAP eligibility
- Students and parents must sign the application electronically using PINs provided by ISAC
 - PINs are e-mailed to the e -mail addresses provided on the application



Financial Aid Applications

WHEN

As soon as possible after October 1st

WHO

High school seniors and college students

HOW

WHY

- Determine eligibility for federal and state aid programs
- Some institutions use these to award institutional aid

Public Act 101 -0180 (FAFSA Graduation Requirement)



FAFSA Graduation Requirement

- Beginning with the 2020 -2021 school year, in addition to all other graduation requirements, a high school senior enrolled in an Illinois public high school must meet one of the following requirements in order to receive a diploma:
 - File a FAFSA; or
 - File an application for state financial aid; or
 - File a waiver/opt -out form with the school district

FAFSA Graduation Requirement Continued

- School districts must:
 - 1. Require each high school student to comply
 - 2. Provide to each high school student and, if applicable, his or her parent or guardian any support or assistance necessary to comply
 - 3. Award a high school diploma to a student who is unable to meet the requirements of subsection (a) due to extenuating circumstances, as determined by the school district, if
 - The student has met all other graduation requirements under the School Code, AND
 - ii. The principal attests that the school district has made a good faith effort to assist the student or, if applicable, his or her parent or guardian in filing an application or waiver

FAFSA/Alternative Application Nonparticipation Form

- Created by the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE)
 - Must be filed with the school district
 - Indicates the parent or guardian or, if applicable, the student understands what the FAFSA and the Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid are and has chosen not to file an application
 - Must use the ISBE waiver form
 - Available in English and Spanish
 - For non-financial aid questions or questions about the waiver/opt -out form, you can email ISBE at <u>fafsa@isbe.net</u>



FAFSA/Alternative Application Nonparticipation Form Continued

- Information requested (p.1)
 - Student information
 - School information
 - Parent/guardian information
- Certification of financial aid application knowledge
- Parent/guardian or student signature

- Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) (p.2)
 - O What is the FAFSA?
- Information on this page must be read to certify that the student will opt out of completing a financial aid application

Frequently Asked Questions about the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA*)

"What is the FAFSA?" The Free Application for Federal Student Aid [FAFSA] is the online application that allows a student to apply simultaneously for federal student aid fortulating the Pell Grant, work-study opportunities, and federal student loans) and the Illinois Monetary Award Program (MAP) grant. Many colleges and universities use it for their aid programs, too. The Alternative Application for Illinois Financial Aid is a similar application that provides a path for some students who do not qualify for federal aid to apply for state and school-funded assistance. The maximum state MAP grant for the 2011-22 school year is 55,495. The maximum Federal Pell Grant award is 56,495 for the 21-22 award year (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022). The amount is not yet set for the 22-22 ascademic yet.

"isn't the application too long and difficult to complete?" Most applicants complete the FAFSA in about 30 minutes. If you have questions, talk to your school counselor. Help is also available for FREE from the Illinois Student Assistance Commission (studentportal.isac.org).

"If I want to learn a trade, can the FAFSA still be of assistance to me?" The FAFSA still just for associate's or bachelor's degree programs! Students can receive need-based Pell grants, federal student loans, and other federal student aid for technical, trade, and vocational programs at community colleges and at many other schools and training programs. Students can check with the school they want to attend or use the federal government's online College Navigator tool to find out which institutions participate in the programs: https://creace-gov/collegen-wquator/.

"Does my family make too much money to benefit from the FAFSAP" Financial aid is left on the table every year by students who didn't apply because they erroneously thought they were ineligible. You really don't know until you apply income and assets are factors in determining your eligibility, but so are things like the number of students in the family who are in school and the age of the parents). For students from families that do make too much to qualify for need-based grant aid, the FAFSA can still be helpful, since it's needed for work-study, an AIM HIGH grant from one of our public universities, or a federal student loan (susually at competitive rates and with more borrower protections than private loans, including options for income-based repayment and forgiveness programs for some careers). Your college may offer aid based on your FAFSA info and your eligibility may be different depending on your school. Additionally, some scholarship programs use information from the FAFSA as part of the application process. As most financial aid is awarded in date or order based on FAFSA fling date, it, is a very good idea to complete the FAFSA as early as possible. This "place in line" can be used for opportunities that come up later, and also can be used if family financial circumstances suddenly changes.

"What if I don't want a student loan?" Filing the application doesn't commit you to anything. You'll just find out whether you might be eligible for aid!

"How is FAFSA data protected?" I don't want my information sold, and I don't want my school to have it." By I buy, your personally identifiable information (PII) in the FAFSA can only be used in furtherance of administering financial aid, including research. Although your high school will know whether you completed the FAFSA, it will not have access to the

FAFSA Completion Initiative Overview



Financial Aid Application Completion Tool

- ISAC offers the Financial Aid Application Completion Initiative to assist public and private high schools in identifying students who have not completed a FAFSA/Alternative Application
- It is a resource for Illinois high schools to keep track of their students' financial aid application completion
- Helps schools identify students who may need assistance with the financial aid process
- Can be used to document compliance with the ISBE FAFSA graduation requirement



Financial Aid Data Matching

- ISAC receives public high school senior class data from ISBE
- Private schools must complete a student record upload
- The student roster is then matched with FAFSAs and Alternative Applications that are filed each week
- ISAC provides participating high schools with updated information every Monday through the GAP Access portal

Note: A roster that is uploaded by the school is the best way to ensure an accurate completion match and rate



Financial Aid Application Completion Performance Metrics

- Current high school completion rate
- Can sort and filter to search any high school across the state
- Can compare up to two years of completion data
- Data updated every week





2021 Recognition of Excellence

- All schools with an award will receive the center banner the first year they place
- Award period for the Class of '21 was from October 1, 2020 August 21, 2021
 - 26 Platinum schools
 - 76 Gold schools
 - 127 Silver schools
 - 202 Bronze schools

Class of '21 Completion Awards



Platinum > 95% 26 Schools



Silver > 75% 127 Schools





Gold > 85% 76 Schools



Bronze > 65% 202 Schools



2022 Recognition Calculation and Participation Criteria

- Award period for Class of '22
 - October 1, 2021 June 30, 2022
 - 67% will be Bronze based on the Class of '21 average
- Public schools
 - ISAC will use ISBEprovided data to prepopulate rosters
- Private school
 - Must complete a student record upload for the entire class of 2022 into the GAP Access portal at least once during the award period


GAP Access Portal Sign -Up

- The FAFSA Completion Initiative tool is only available to high schools
- School principal must certify and agree to the terms and conditions
 - School principal can then designate privileges to authorized users


School Summary

- School summary will include:
 - Graduation year
 - Class size
 - Filed a financial aid application
 - Filed, has EFC
 - Filed, no EFC
 - Pell eligible
 - MAP eligible
 - Total Opt Out




Data by Graduation Year

- Once graduating class has been selected, user will have access to:
 - Opt-Out Waiver checkbox
 - Individual data
 - Application filing status
 - Date application was received
 - MAP eligibility



Add and Delete Function


- Add student records to your school's list
- Delete student records that should not appear on the school's list
- Users can edit students date of birth and name
- Changes will be reflected immediately, but data is matched every Monday





Reports

- Schools can download a report that mirrors the format of the Graduation Year screen in excel format
- Data can be sorted as needed
- Schools should monitor their school rosters and make any updates as necessary
- ISBE will accept reports for compliance



FAFSA Graduation Requirement Compliance

- The ISAC generated roster can be saved/printed to demonstrate compliance for the entire class having submitted a financial aid application or a non -participation form
 - You must participate in ISAC's FAFSA Completion Initiative in order to access this report
- Paper/electronic waivers can be kept in the individual student file or with the master list for the entire class
- This requirement must be met by July 31 st of the graduating class year along with all other ISBE graduation requirements


ISAC Corps Provides Year -Round Help

NCAN FAFSA Tracker

As of 2/18/22 for the Senior Class of 2022

- Illinois' FAFSA completion rate is 50.3%
 - IL ranks #3 nationally
 - National completion rate is 37.7%
- Compared to the Class of 2021, during the same period
 - There is a 0.4% increase in the FAFSA completion rate in Illinois
 - There is a 1.7% increase in the overall national FAFSA completion rate
