

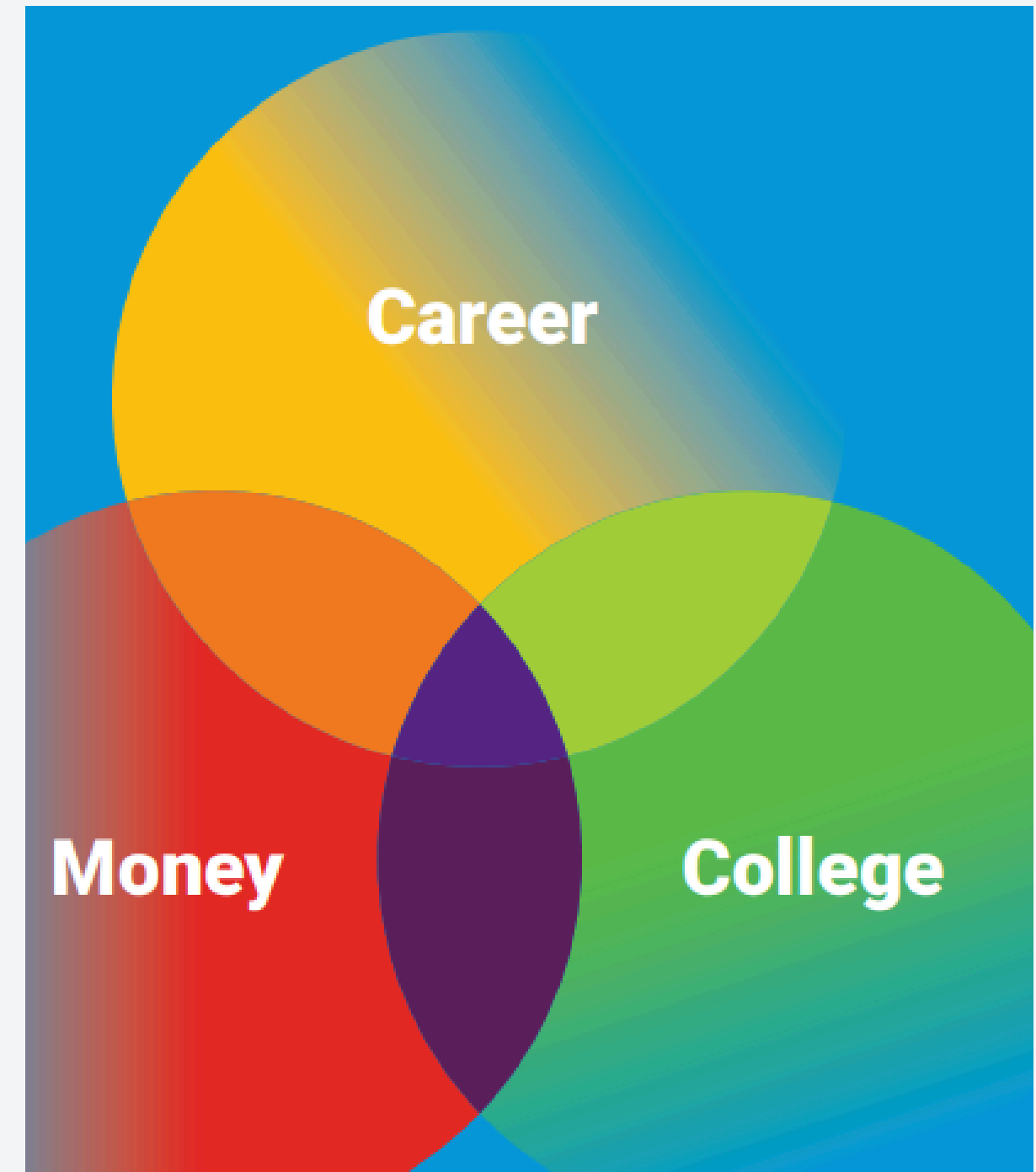

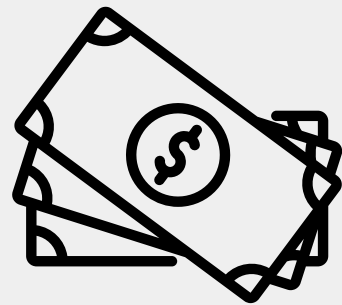


# 9TH GRADE

## College

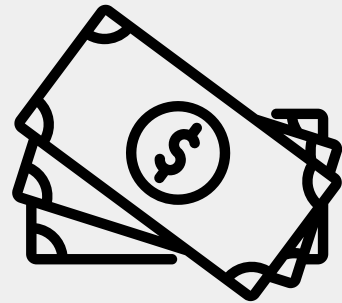
- Talk to your counselor about what classes and grades you need

- Research the academic requirements that you need to meet

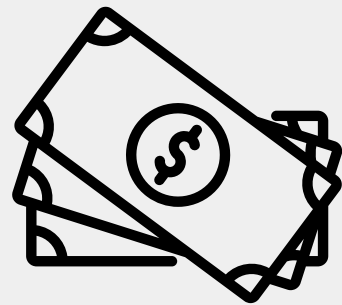


# 11TH GRADE

- Visit 2-3 colleges

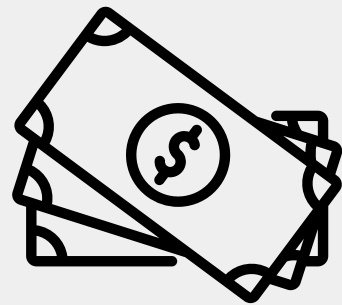
# 12TH GRADE
