

A Closer Look at SCNC

Per National Student Clearinghouse Research Center July 2022 report, the SCNC population under 65 yrs of age is 36.8 million (a 2.9 % increase from the prior year).

Of that, more than half were 25 (or older) when last enrolled.

There are fewer white students, and more males than overall undergrad population.

The number is growing; college persistence has tracked below 50% for the past five years.

More than 80% SCNC population who re-enroll are (or will be) transfer students, often with credit from multiple sources.

Many attend part-time, have fewer financial aid/scholarship opportunities, are parents, are responsible for family income, and/or need flexible programs.

Influenced by the 'demographic cliff' (reducing # traditional-aged college students), post-secondary education seeks ways to re-engage, re-enroll & support these learners.





Illinois SCNC

Illinois has 4th largest SCNC population in the US, behind California, Texas & New York.

2023: 1,942,815 2022: 1,892,039 2019: 1,779,078 (nearly 5% of nation's total)

SCNC **re-enrollment trend** by age in Illinois:

Under 25: 2,221 | 25-34: 4,277 | prime age 20-34: 6,498 | 35-44: 2,085 | 45-64: 1,685

Unpaid debt to institutions was causing "stranded credits" – Illinois addressed this by legislation & policy.

Last week Gov Pritzker proposed Community College Baccalaureate (CCB) program, which could greatly impact the SCNC population.

How Universities are Supporting SCNC Completion

- EIU has new <u>B.A.A.S</u>. programs that are 100% asynchronous online, including credit for prior learning and "earn while you learn" opportunities
- SIUC's <u>Capstone option</u>, for technically oriented associates degrees with abbreviated core curriculum requirements, and the <u>University Studies</u> degree
- TransferBoost pilot project sponsored by IBHE, ICCB; 5 participating CC's and 3 universities strengthened pathways agreements
- Credit for Prior Learning policy and stackable credentials
