

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.

What the Data is Telling Us...

Survey results collected from the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) on the top 10 skills employers want in graduates. The top four skills are directly related to SEL competencies:

- 1. Ability to work in a team structure (relationship skills)
- 2. Ability to make decision and solve problems (decision-making)
- 3. Ability to communicate verbally with people inside and outside an organization (social awareness)
- 4. Ability to plan, organize and prioritize work (goal-directed behavior)

Strategic Plan Goal 3: Safe and Healthy Environments

Foster a positive culture and climate that supports the health and social-emotional well-being of every student.

- 3.1 Provide all students access to a comprehensive Pre-K through 12 social and emotional learning curriculum and assessment tools.
- 3.2 Ensure District 189 will be a fully implemented, trauma-informed school district that uses social emotional standards as a basis for reviewing, revising, and implementing policies, procedures, and practices in our district while fully supporting students.
- 3.3 Establish a fully operational Family Engagement Center to support students, parents, and families as well as provide services, support, and engagement in a centralized location.
- 3.4 Ensure all schools encourage a clean, healthy, and positive/supportive lifestyle, culture, and climate for all children.
- 3.5 Apply the use of Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) to guide social-emotional supports and interventions at all schools.







Out-of-School Time

Survey of Academic and Youth Outcomes (SAYO)

SAYO-Y (Youth Survey):

- A youth self-report assessment that helps organizations better understand youth's program experience and personal development
- Assesses social-emotional competencies including peer relationships, youth voice and self-awareness
- Results are aggregated at the site- or organization levels to understand how programs are supporting social-emotional development of youth overall

In Greater East St. Louis:

- 4 organizations
- 11 program sites
- 293 youth
