TECHNOLOGY OF PARTICIPATION (ToP) FOCUSED CONVERSATION

- Approximately 1-1.5 hours
- Facilitate a meaningful exchange of ideas, gain a broader and deeper understanding of a topic, process difficult issues, reflect on a shared experience and decided what to do as a result.
- It ensures that every stage of processing information is thought through carefully and in detail so that one can come to a conclusion based on a wide range of data.



TECHNOLOGY OF PARTICIPATION (ToP) CONSENSUS WORKSHOP

- Approximately 2-3 hours
- Infuse a group with creative energy and bring diverse opinions and perspectives into an agreement everyone can own and support.
- This method helps a group in generating creative solutions from multiple perspectives.
- Main goal is to work through conflict and achieve consensus among a group.



TECHNOLOGY OF PARTICIPATION (ToP) ACTION PLANNING WORKSHOP

- Approximately 4 hours
- Used to plan single-focus event or project with a clear beginning and end.
- It presumes a broad, prior agreement to move forward and works best for events and projects that take a year or less of planning.
- Common uses for the ToP Action Planning include developing a project plan, planning a community event, planning a conference, planning a celebration, and more.



PAST TECHNOLOGY OF PARTICIPATION (ToP) WORKSHOPS

 - Consensus Workshop What can we do to support the IL 60 by 25 Network strategic focus areas?
