## 9th Grade **Main Points:**

Career:

- Complete a career cluster survey and a career interest survey.
- Explore career clusters.
- Research 1-2 careers based on survey results.

## Money:

- Attend a college financial aid presentation accompanied by a adult relative.
- Research the financial costs for postsecondary options to compare and contrast.

## College:

- Talk with your counselor to discuss postsecondary life and opportunities.
  - Attend postsecondary options workshop, course, or presentation. Indulge in different community services and extracurricular activities related to postsecondary life.

## 10th Grade Main Points:

## Career:

- Visit a possible place of future employment.
- Research jobs for salary and requirements.
- ☐ Participate in career-centered activities: (Presentations, and Workshops).

### Money:

- Attend a college financial aid presentation accompanied by a adult relative.

## 11th Grade **Main Points:**

## Career:

- Revisit and retake the career interest survey from 9th grade.
- To prepare for getting a job, seek out an adult to do a mock interview with you.
- Build a resume and have it reviewed by an adult.
- Create a personal statement for college applications and have it reviewed by an adult.

## Money:

Check postsecondary education websites for their priority deadlines to file a FAFSA or other application, cost, and whether the school accepts financial aid.

- College:
- Determine math and reading classes you need to take before entering college.
- Talk to your counselor about classes you can take to receive college credit. Research colleges for tour opportunities, scholarships, degrees, programs, and requirements.

# 12th Grade Main Points:

#### **Career:**

- Take advantage of a internship or summer job to learn more about your future field.
- Research industry-based certifications, the requirements to obtain them, and whether your school awards them.
- ☐ Complete a career-focused project with a group of friends.

#### Money:

- ☐ Complete the FAFSA or other applications with a trusted adult.
- Speak with your parents about possible colleges, financial aid offers, costs, and future plans.
- Research the average entry-level salary and debt of postsecondary options.
- Research loans, the requirements to sustain them, and compare and contrast their features.

### College:

- □ Apply to 3 or more postsecondary education options.
- ☐ Talk to your counselor to verify that all the steps in the postsecondary process are finished.
