

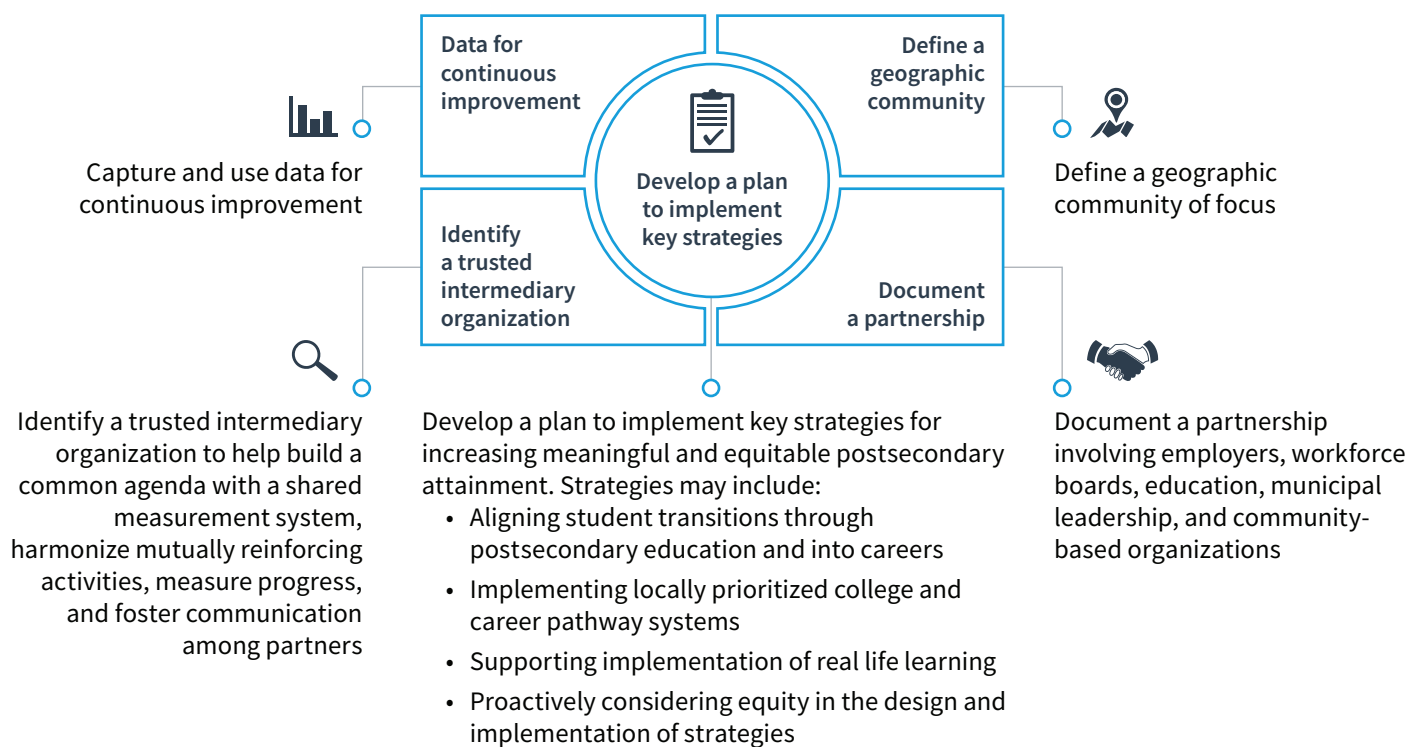
Executive Summary

Today, the majority of employers say they need employees with some postsecondary education. However, only 56.9% of Illinois residents have a high-quality college degree or postsecondary credential (according to the Lumina Foundation).

The Illinois P-20 Council set a goal to increase the number of adults with high-quality college degrees and postsecondary credentials to 60% by the year 2025. The Illinois Education and Career Success Network was launched in 2013 (under the name Illinois 60 by 25 Network) to support communities across the state progress towards the postsecondary goal. The Success Network is organized by: Advance Illinois, Education Systems Center at Northern Illinois University, and the Illinois Student Assistance Commission. Learn more at ILSuccessNetwork.org.
